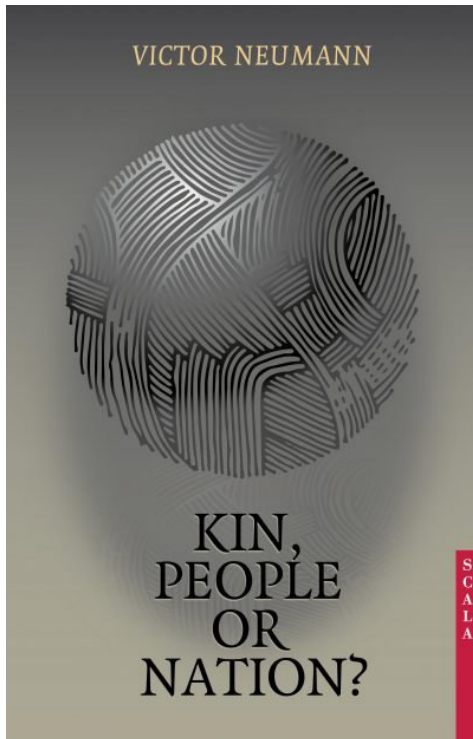


# KIN, PEOPLE OR NATION?

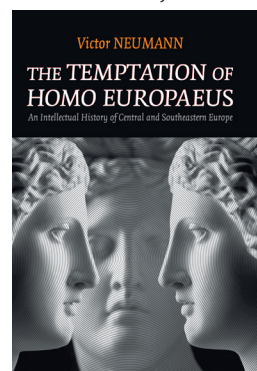
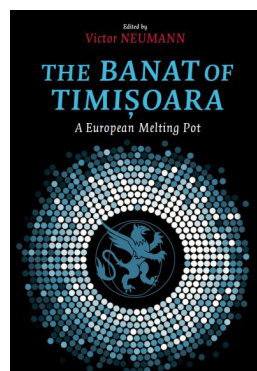


With a focus on the origins and evolution of political identity, this book explores the way different linguistic communities have defined kin, ethnicity, citizenship and the nation.
